Type	Variety	Description
Broccoli	DiCicco	Heirloom, many side branches
Broccoli	Fiesta	Organic hybrid, midseason compact plants with full domed heads, withstands hot weather
Br. Sprouts	Churchill	Little cabbages on a long stalk. Best variety for organic growers.
Cabbage	Gonzales	Hybrid, early baby heads (softball size), good keeper
Cabbage	Red Express	Like Gonzales with red color
Celery	Ventura	Open pollinated, rich flavor, easy to grow, some disease resistance, young plants need adequate moisture
Corn	Luscious	Hybrid sweet corn, bicolor on 8" ears, 77 days to maturity, good cold soil tolerance
Cuke	Boothby's Blonde	Open pollinated, short and plump oval fruits 3"-4" become yellow as they mature, juicy refreshing interior with no bitter aftertaste.
Cuke	Marketmore 76	Classic open pollinated, good for slicing, dark green 8" fruits, disease resistant
Cuke	Suyho Long	Open pollinated, sweetest meat of all cucumbers, Asian in origin, 15" long & curly. Can be used for pickling if picked early enough
Eggplant	Rosa Blanca	Italian heirloom, delicate flavor, white with lavender streaking, plump shape, 2 lb. fruit, does best in raised beds and containers.
Eggplant	Swallow	Hybrid, early elongated type, grows in cooler areas
Flower	Autumn Beauty Sunflower	Multi-branching sunflower 7' tall, 5" blooms in bronze, purples, yellows with red ring
Flower	Harlequin Marigold	Heirloom, good companion plant for pest control, blooms striped and single
Flower	Indian Spring Hollyhock	Old fashioned variety, 7' tall, single blooms in red, yellow, white & rose. Favorite of hummingbirds
Flower	Jewel Mix Nasturtium	Companion plant for pest control, edible orange, yellow and red blooms, blooms continuously in cool weather, likes full sun
Greens	Prize Pac Choy	AKA Chinese cabbage, long lasting in the garden, wonderful in stir-fry

Greens	Rainbow Lacinato Kale	Similar to Dinosaur Kale with red and purple overtones, high in anti-oxidants
Greens	Red Russian Kale	Siberian heirloom, oakleaf foliage colors deepest after fall frost, cooks to dark green. Tender with delicate flavor.
Greens	Ruby/Golden Chard Mix	Heirloom varieties, bright yellow and crimson stalks, green leaves. Pretty and delicious!
Greens	Tyee Spinach	Hybrid, slow to bolt, crinkled leaf, upright habit
Greens	Winterbor Kale	Hybrid, most vigorous grower, best in cold hardiness and production. Curled leaves up to 3' tall.
Herb, Culinary	Basil, Aromato	Dramatic bicolor green/purple, great for cooking and herbal vinegar
Herb, Culinary	Basil, Sweet	Heavy yeilding, good for drying, cooking and pesto production
Herb, Culinary	Bouquet Dill	Good for leaf production and seed late in season
Herb, Culinary	Cilantro	This strain is slow to bolt (lasts 1 week instead of 2 days), an essential for salsa
Herb, Culinary	Parsley, Dark Green Italian	Smooth, flat leaves, upright vigorous growth
Herb, Culinary	Parsley, Moss Curled	Frilly with long stems, tolerates heat and repeated cutting
Herb, Medicinal	Ashwagantha	Roots used for rejuvenation without overstimulation, a 2' shrub with red berries
Herb, Medicinal	Blue Vervain	Nervous system tonic, helps with liver and lungs, menstrual disorders. A native perennial with blue flowers. Tolerates wet soil.
Herb, Medicinal	Mad-dog Skullcap	Calms and strengthens nerves, a native spreading perennial that likes rich soil and partial shade
Herb, Medicinal	Narrow-Leaved Coneflower	( <i>Echinacea angustifolia</i> ) roots used as an immune system stimulant, flowers a beautiful pink/purple
Herb, Medicinal	Resina Calendula	Single yellow and orange flowers. Best variety for tinctures and oils
Herb, Medicinal	Sacred Basil	Strengthens immune system and increases blood flow to brain, also good applied for skin problems
Herb, Medicinal	Stinging Nettle	High in minerals, increases potency of other herbs, speading perennial that likes rich soil.
Lettuce	Black Seed Simpson	Earliest looseleaf variety, light green leaves highly productive until July
Lettuce	Bronze Arrowhead	Early colorful companion for BSS, Reddish oakleaf
Lettuce	Lettuce Mix	At least 6 different types of green and red lettuce
Okra	Cajun Jewel	This variety adapted to cooler climate, dwarf plants 3'-4' tall
Ornamental	Bed Broom Corn	Actually sorghum with sprays of red seed heads on top of 8' stalks. Birds love seeds, use heads for brooms and stalks for decoration

Ornamental	Bells of Ireland	Spikes of bright green bells on 2' stems, good for dried flowers, like partial shade
Ornamental	Gremlin Gourds	A miniature gourd mix of colors and shapes
Ornamental	Jack Be Little	Tiny pumpkins that are edible! Vines 3'-5'
Pepper	Anaheim	Known as green chile, a mild pepper used extensively in Mexican cooking, esp. chile relenos
Pepper	Early Jalapeno	Hot variety for Mexican cooking, good for northern climates
Pepper	Lipstick, Bell	Early and small pointed fruits have mild/sweet flavor on smaller plants
Pepper	Peacework, Bell	Pick immature green, ripening to red. 6 fruits/plant common, compact plants
Pepper	Thai Hot	Up to 200 fruits/plant! One of the hottest but also very ornamental and can be brought inside as a houseplant.
Pumpkin	Baby Bear	Small pumpkin, flesh good in pies, seeds hullless for snacking.
Pumpkin	Howden	Classic Jack O' Lantern because of symmetry and size
Squash, Summer	Costata Romanesca	Sweet, mildly nutty flavor, firmer than regular zucchini, blossoms good for cooking
Squash, Summer	Early Crookneck	Yellow Heirloom, better flavor than straightneck. Pick when young.
Squash, Summer	Jackpot Zucchini	High yields of dark green fruits. Bushy plant, pick when 6"-7"
Squash, Winter	Baby Blue Hubbard	Smaller than the standard Blue Hubbard (thank goodness!), on a compact plant
Squash, Winter	Bush Buttercup	Similar to Burgess buttercup on a compact plant. One of the sweetest fleshed squash.
Squash, Winter	Carnival Acorn	Multi-colored acorn-type, long-keeper, great nutty flavor on a semi-bush habitat
Tomatillo	Husk Cherry	AKA Pineapple tomatillo, golden grape-sized fruits inside wrappers. Delightful sweet & savory flavor.
Tomato, Cherry	Gardener's Delight	Ind. Many layers of taste in each bite. Ayn's favorite red cherry.
Tomato, Cherry	Jelly Bean, Grape	Smaller than a cherry and fun to eat!
Tomato, Cherry	Sungold	Ind. Always a favorite with orange skin and deep sweet tomato flavor. Very productive.
Tomato, Paste	Amish Paste	Ind. Heirloom. Large, meaty, heart-shaped fruit, does well even in bad tomato years, great in sauce.
Tomato, Paste	Heinz 2653	Det. Early red plum type, 3 oz fruits ripen all at same time. Heavy yields early
Tomato, Paste	Orange Banana	Ind. Reportedly makes the best sauce, similar to Sungold in flavor, also good dried.

Tomato, Salad	Bloody Butcher	Ind. Heirloom, A farm favorite for taste, reliability and productivity!
Tomato, Salad	Tigerella	Ind. Red with orange stripes, The best overall producer in rainy 2009. Bred in England.
Tomato, Slicer	Black Krim	Ind. Heirloom, Dark purple flesh, almost black. Smoky flavor and great contrast in salads
Tomato, Slicer	Brandywine	Ind. Heirloom, The gold standard for tomato taste. Fruits large, up to 1 lb.
Tomato, Slicer	Cosmonaut Volkov	Heirloom from Ukraine, early 8 oz fruits perfectly round with sweet, rich true tomato taste
Tomato, Slicer	Golden Jubilee	Orange Tomato, somewhat disease resistant, sweet flavor without the acid.
Tomato, Slicer	Mortgage Lifter	Ind. Known for producing the biggest tomatoes in good years, Great story behind the name!
Tomato, Slicer	Pineapple	Ind. Complex fruity taste without acidity. Red with yellow streaking in large fruit. Ayn's favorite slicer.
Tomato, Slicer	Rutgers	Ind. Developed for Campbell's soup in 1928. Good old-fashioned flavor with disease resistance.
